SAINTS THIS WEEK: Nativity St. John the Baptist; June 24.

John was the son of Zechariah, a priest in the Jewish law; and of Elizabeth, a cousin to the Blessed Virgin Mary. His upcoming birth had been announced to Zechariah by an angel. Prompted by the angel's visit to her, Mary came to visit her cousin giving rise to the feast of the visitation (May 31).

The birth of John was first celebrated as part of the Epiphany, then from the late fourth century, on June 24, six months before the birth of Jesus.

FEASTS THIS WEEK: Solemnity of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus; June 27.

Celebrated on the Friday after the second Sunday after Pentecost, we recall that the blood and water which poured out when Jesus' side was pierced by the soldier's lance are the price of our salvation, and the source of the sacraments in the Church.

St. Margaret Mary (virgin, 1690, October 17) received several revelations from the Lord Jesus, asking that his heart be honoured under the form of a heart of flesh. These revelations began in 1673 while she was a Visitation nun in France. In 1675 her final revelation led Margaret to begin a campaign that would act against the ingratitude towards the goodness and mercy shown by the

human race toward the Sacred Heart of Jesus. In 1685 this feast began to be celebrated privately throughout France. In 1765 Pope Clement XIII authorized the Mass of the Sacred Heart, and in 1856, Pope Pius IX made it universal.

This sacrament may be received at any time and any place. It is given by a priest or bishop, to a person who is at least 7 years old. It may be received either by one person, or as a communal activity.

In our parish we will celebrate this Sacrament on Wednesday, June 25 during the 9:00 am Mass.
